

RESOLUTION NO. 5255

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RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, MAKING ITS ORDER VACATING PORTIONS OF CERTAIN STREETS COMMONLY KNOWN AS SIERRA STREET, LOCHMOOR AVENUE AND LEXINGTON AVENUE, WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA.

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of January, 1952, Ordinance No. 1692 of the City of Riverside, California, was adopted, declaring the intention of the City Council to vacate portions of certain streets commonly known as Sierra Street, Lochmoor Avenue and Lexington Avenue, as shown on a certain map on file with the City Clerk of Riverside, California; and,

WHEREAS, it was set forth in said Ordinance that the portions of Sierra Street, Lochmoor Avenue and Lexington Avenue sought to be vacated are located in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, and more particularly described as follows:

Sierra Street, a street thirty feet (30') in width, Lochmoor Avenue and Lexington Avenue, both streets fifty feet (50') in width, as shown on map of Lochmoor Heights recorded in Book 14, page 6, of Maps, Records of Riverside County, California, excepting therefrom the easterly eighteen feet (18') of the above named streets.

WHEREAS, in said ordinance the time of hearing was set for Tuesday, March 4, 1952, at 10 o'clock A.M. in the Council Chambers located in the City Hall, Seventh and Orange Streets, Riverside, California, at which said time and place all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation be allowed to be heard; and,

WHEREAS, notices of the proposed street vacation were posted conspicuously along the lines of the portions of Sierra Street, Lochmoor Avenue and Lexington Avenue sought to be vacated; and that notices were posted not more than 300 feet apart, and there were more than three (3) of said notices posted, and said notices were posted at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said hearing.
