

RESOLUTION NO. 5974

1 RECALCULATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
 2 RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, MAKING THE FINDINGS AND
 3 DETERMINATIONS IN THE MATTER OF CANCELLATION OF
 4 INTENTION NO. 1937, AND ORDER OF VACATION IN
 5 THE MATTER OF VACATING A PORTION OF A CERTAIN
 6 STREET COMMONLY KNOWN AS MARY STREET.

7 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Riverside, California,
 8 adopted an ordinance of intention No. 1937 pursuant to the pro-
 9 visions of the Street Vacation Act of 1911, being Part 3, Divi-
 10 sion 9 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California,
 11 declaring its intention to vacate a portion of a street commonly
 12 known as MARY STREET, therein and hereinafter described;
 13 and,

14 WHEREAS, the matter came on regularly for hearing before said
 15 City Council at the time and place fixed for hearing by said ordi-
 16 nance of intention, and said City Council heard and considered all of
 17 the evidence submitted,

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that it be
 19 and it hereby found and determined by said City Council that said
 20 ordinance of intention was duly passed, adopted and published in
 21 the manner prescribed by law for the adopting and publishing of
 22 ordinances of said City, and the notice of said vacation proceed-
 23 ings and of the time and place of hearing was given by posting,
 24 as provided by the Street Vacation Act of 1911, and that the said
 25 portion of the public street therein described is unnecessary for
 26 present or prospective public purposes and should be vacated,

27 AND, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of the said Street
 28 Vacation Act of 1911 it is hereby ordered by the City Council of
 29 the City of Riverside, California, that the portion of that certain
 30 street commonly known as Mary Street, in the City of
 Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, described as
 follows, to-wit:

All of that portion of Mary Street as conveyed by the Roman Catholic
 Bishop of San Diego to the City of Riverside by instrument No. 394
 recorded February 4, 1947, in Book 819, page 192, Official Records of
 Riverside County, California, which lies westerly from the following
 described line:

Beginning at the intersection of the southerly prolongation of the
 westerly line of Brockton Avenue with the center line of Arlington
 Avenue; thence South 00° 26' West, a distance of thirty feet (30.00');
 thence along a curve concave to the east, having a radius of three
 hundred forty feet (340.00') and a central angle of 29° 00', a dis-
 tance of one hundred seventy-two and nine hundredths feet (172.09');
 thence S 28° 34' East, a distance of three hundred sixty and ninety-
 one hundredths feet (360.91'); thence along a curve concave to the
 northeast, having a radius of five hundred ninety feet (590.00') and
 a central angle of 13° 04' 20", a distance of one hundred thirty-four
 and sixty-one hundredths feet (134.61'); thence S 41° 38' 20" East,
 a distance of five and seventy-eight hundredths feet (5.78'); thence
 along a curve concave to the southwest, having a radius of fourteen
 hundred eighty and twenty-eight hundredths feet (1,480.28') to the
 southeast corner of the property conveyed by Roy A. Stillman, et al
 to the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego by instrument No. 2280,

recorded June 15, 1916, in Book 747, page 552, Official Records of
 Riverside County, California, excepting therefrom any portion of the
 above described parcel lying within the limits of Arlington Avenue;
