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## RESOLUTION NO. 961 (NEW SERIES)

Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Riverside declaring that the work of closing up and vacating a portion of Evergreen Avenue in said City has been completed and that the same is closed up and vacated.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Riverside did on the 29th day of June, 1926, pass its Resolution No. 952 (New Series) ordering the work of closing up and vacating a portion of Evergreen Avenue in said City, hereinafter described, as contemplated by Resolution of Intention No. 916 (New Series) and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Streets of said City has reported to said Common Council that the work of closing up and vacating said portion of Evergreen Avenue has been done and completed,

Now therefore be it Resolved, that the Common Council of the City of Riverside, hereby declares that the portion of Evergreen Avenue in said City hereinafter described is closed up and vacated as a public street in said City.

The portion of Evergreen Avenue heretofore referred to and affected by this Resolution is described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the northerly line of Eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) Street, fifty (50) feet Westerly from the Southeasterly corner of Block 7, Range 1, Map of Town of Riverside, as recorded in Book 7 of Maps, page 17, Records of San Bernardino County, California; thence Northerly parallel with the westerly line of said Block 7 to the Southerly line of Seventh Street; thence Westerly along the Southerly line of Seventh Street fourteen (14) feet, thence Southerly parallel with the Westerly line of

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said Block 7 to the Northerly line of Eighth (8) Street; thence easterly along the North-line of Eighth (8) Street fourteen (14) feet to the point of beginning.

Above description is intended to describe the rectangular strip fourteen (14) feet wide of street described in deed recorded January 17, 1888 in Book 68 of Deeds, page 359, Records of San Bernardino.
