## RESOLUTION NO. 1405 (NEW SERIES)

*BK. 770 - P. 575*

Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Riverside declaring that the work of closing up and vacating that portion of Fifteenth Street from the Westerly boundary of the right of way of the Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad to the easterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside Water Company's Canal, has been completed and that the same is closed up and vacated.

Whereas, The Common Council of the City of Riverside did on the 26th day of June, 1928, pass its resolution No. 1385 (New Series) ordering the work of closing up and vacating that portion of Fifteenth Street, from the westerly boundary line of the right of way of the Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad to the easterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside Water Company's Canal, hereinafter described, as contemplated by Resolution of Intention No. 1342 (New Series) and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets of said City has reported to said Common Council that the work of closing up and vacating said portion of Fifteenth Street has been done and completed.

Now therefore be it resolved: That the Common Council of the City of Riverside, California, hereby determines that that portion of Fifteenth Street in said City, hereinafter described, is closed up and vacated.

The portion of Fifteenth Street affected by this Resolution is particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northwesterly corner of Block 10 of D. C. Twogood's Orange Grove Tract, as recorded in Book 7 of Maps, page 42 records of San Bernardino County, California; thence easterly along the northerly line of said Block 10 (being the southerly line of Fifteenth Street) to the westerly line of the right of

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way of the Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad; thence Northerly along the westerly line of that portion of said right of way located south of Fifteenth Street, produced northerly to the center line of Fifteenth Street; thence westerly along the center line of Fifteenth Street to a point of intersection with the westerly line of that portion of said right of way located north of Fifteenth Street, produced southerly; thence northerly along said line, produced Southerly to the Northerly line of Fifteenth Street; thence Westerly along the northerly line of Fifteenth Street to the easterly line of the right of way of the Riverside Water Company's Canal; thence southerly along the easterly line of said right of way to the point of beginning
