

RESOLUTION NO. 1479 NEW SERIES) *BR. 792 - p. 297* ✓

Resolution declaring the Closing up and Vacating has been completed.

Aurora Drive.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Riverside, did on the 27th day of November, 1928, pass its Resolution No. 1474 (New Series), ordering the work of closing up and vacating that portion of Aurora Drive in said City hereinafter described as contemplated by Resolution of Intention No. 1461 (New Series), and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Streets of said City has reported to said Common Council that the work of closing up and vacating said portion of Aurora Drive has been done and completed.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Common Council hereby determines that that portion of Aurora Drive in said City hereinafter described, is closed up and vacated.

That portion of Aurora Drive affected by this Resolution is particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northeasterly corner of Lot 8, River Crest Tract, as recorded in Book 6 of Maps, page 17, Records of Riverside County, California, thence westerly along the southerly line of Aurora Drive as shown on said River Crest Tract, also as shown by Subdivision of Lot 9, River Crest Tract, as recorded in Book 9 of Maps, page 4, Records of Riverside County, California, and Beacon Heights, as recorded in Book 15 of Maps, pages 84 and 85, Records of Riverside County, California, to the point of compound curve, said point being the end of curve with an arc of 22 degrees 40 minutes, radius of 335.25 feet, and the length being 132.63 feet; thence reversing north 45 degrees 49 minutes, 30 seconds east, 72.32 feet; thence along a curve concave to the south with a radius of 155.07 feet, through an arc of 24 degrees 1 minute 30 seconds, a distance of 65.02 feet; thence north 69 degrees 51 minutes east, 12.60 feet; thence along a curve concave to the south with a radius of 183.3 feet, through an arc of 19 degrees 47 minutes, a distance of 63.29 feet; thence north 89 degrees 38 minutes east 10 feet; thence on a curve concave to the northwest with a radius of 80.85 feet, through an arc of 68 degrees 0 minutes, a distance of 95.95 feet; thence north 21 degrees 38 minutes east, 13.5 feet; thence south 68 degrees 22 minutes east, 6.5 feet; thence north 19 degrees 34 minutes

east 14.1 feet; thence on a curve, concave to the southeast, with a radius of 152.95 feet through an arc of 37 degrees 11 minutes, a distance of 99.26 feet; thence on a curve, concave to the southeast, with a radius of 266.7 feet, through an arc of 21 degrees 0 minutes, a distance of 97.75 feet; thence north 77 degrees 45 minutes east, 95 feet; thence south 83 degrees 30 minutes east 32.3 feet; thence North 79 degrees 54 minutes east 10.55 feet; thence north 65 degrees 21 minutes east, 31.54 feet to the point of beginning.
